# **Parenting Team**

- Promote understanding of children's behaviour within the context of developmental issues
- Promote the development of parent/child relationship
- Increase confidence and self-esteem in both parents and children
- Give parents a strategy for repair when things go wrong
- Promote reflective, sensitive and effective parenting

The Parenting Team are also offering free SLEEP TIGHT groups from September 2025 (information attached). These 5-week workshops cover:

- Recognising the role of sleep hygiene to improve sleep
- Identifying causes of sleep issues and appropriate practical strategies to try
- Completing sleep diaries and identifying potential sleep issues

# Poland - Year 10

In the early hours of Sunday 29th June Twenty of our Year 10 students headed off to Heathrow airport bound for Poland. On arrival in Poland, pupils were given a taste of the city, walking through the main square to the Wawel castle district, and to see Krakow's fire breathing dragon statue.

After a good sleep, we headed off on the Monday to the Galicia Jewish Museum for a guided tour and a meeting with a local lady who told us about how her family had risked their lives to help a Jewish woman survive the war. Pupils were then given time in the Jewish district to lunch with their friends before going on a guided tour of the Jewish ghetto, where they saw remnants of the ghetto wall and heard about the appalling treatment of Jewish people by the Nazis.

Tuesday saw another early start as we headed off to Auschwitz-Birkenau, the Nazis largest concentration and death camp, pupils were moved by what they saw and heard, and many talked about the value and importance of witnessing this site for themselves.

The final evening was spent bowling and having fun with friends, before spending Wednesday sightseeing in the main square and cloth hall, before heading to the salt mine, which was spectacular, pupils climbed down 800 steps and were impressed by the underground cathedral and amused by the invite to lick the salt mine walls!

Year 10 were a credit to Lacon Childe and behaved respectfully throughout the trip. Well done Year 10! A huge thank you goes to Mrs Rawnsley for her fantastic organisation of the trip and to Mr Roff and Mrs Dolphin for giving up their time.

# **Mock Trial – Regional Champions!**

The annual national mock trial competition is an event where school students take on the roles within a court room and act out a criminal case to determine whether a defendant is guilty or not.

In March, Lacon Childe's 2025 mock trial team, consisting of 15 students aged between 12 and 14, competed in the local heat of the national mock trial competition at Worcester Magistrates' Court, and brought home the trophy for the eighth time. Next the team faced tougher competition from the schools that had reached the regional final that took place on Saturday 28<sup>th</sup> June at North Staffordshire Justice Centre in Newcastle-Under-Lyme.

The defence team was up first against Wilmslow School. The defendant was accused of stealing four bikes from the entrance hall of a block of flats, vandalising three of them and keeping one for themselves. The defence's case held firm and with lack of a positive identification, the defendant was found not guilty. When it was Lacon Childe's turn to prosecute, they faced another Shropshire school: Meole Brace. The standard of advocacy was extremely high but the witnesses held their nerve. After much deliberation by the magistrates, this trial also ended in a not guilty verdict.

The team received high praise from the judges and dignitaries present, including the High Sheriff of Stafford and the Lord Lieutenant of Staffordshire, Sir Ian Dudson. Once the scores were collated, Lacon Childe was crowned as this year's winning team, much to the elation of the students, Mrs Britton their coach and the supporting parents. This Young Citizens scheme has provided our students with a rare opportunity to learn about the workings of the UK justice system: aside from all of the formality and etiquette of the courtroom, the

students also got a taste of life on the other side of the bars with a visit to the cells below the courts. It has been an unforgettable experience for these incredible students who have been a joy to work with.
