
Attendance Matters - Minutes Matter

Being in school is important to your child's achievement, wellbeing, and wider development. Evidence shows that the students with the highest attendance throughout their time in school gain the best GCSE results. Research found that students who performed better at the end of secondary school missed fewer days than those who didn't perform as well. This was true for us this summer with students with 95+% attendance achieving significantly higher grades than those without.

The data tells us secondary school pupils who didn't achieve grade 9 to 4 in English and maths missed 10 more days on average over the key stage than those who achieved grade 9 to 5 in both English and Maths.

What are the risks of missing a day of school?

Every moment in school counts, and days missed add up quickly. For example, a child in Year 10 who is absent for three days over a half term could miss 15 lessons in total. The higher a student's attendance, the more they are likely to learn, and the better they are likely to perform in exams and formal assessments.



Taster Day and Open Evening

On Monday we held our Year 6 Taster Day when over 130 students from a wide variety of primary schools sampled what Lacon Childe is like first hand, ably supported by our Year 8 young leaders. This was followed later by our Year 6 Open Evening, and it was great to meet so many potential Lacon students and their families. There was a real buzz of excitement around the school. We received lots of positive feedback, and if you were one of our visitors, thank you so much for coming.

A huge thank you to all of our existing students who returned to school in the evening and either welcomed our visitors, helped out as tour guides, or volunteered in the different subject areas. We were extremely proud of our students, and they were amazing ambassadors for our school. A special thank you to our senior prefects Harry Hall and Theony Packard for hosting the evening and to our new Year 7 students Nate Rogers, Rory Evans, Georgia Turner and Sophia Smith-Hughes who spoke so eloquently about their first four weeks at Lacon Childe.

Our students are truly wonderful, and we couldn't have done it without them.

Castles Visits - Year 7

Last week Year 7 visited Goodrich Castle in Herefordshire to enrich their studies of History, 7 Clee and 7 Mortimer went on Wednesday 25th September with 7 Stretton and Wrekin going the following day. The focus of the trip was to use the castle as an example of physical evidence and use the evidence on site to decide if the castle's main purpose was for show down (defence) or to show off. The castle is one of the best-preserved Medieval castles in England and was developed by the Normans to help defend the border with Wales. Year 7 students enjoyed climbing the steep stone staircase to take in the view at the top of the keep, they walked the moat, and studied key features such as the Great Hall and Gatehouse. The students particularly enjoyed some time spent in the dungeon and finding the old murder holes. The weather was very kind to us and the rain held off to allow us to study the castle without getting drenched, we even had blue skies for a time, as you can see from the photo. A great time was had by all, and it was an informative and enjoyable trip. Well done Year 7!
