## Shropshire Holiday Activities and Food programme

Shropshire HAF (Holiday Activities and Food) managed by Shropshire Council is an exciting programme of holiday activities for eligible children and young people.

Over the Christmas holidays, schools, voluntary and community organisations and childcare providers will be running holiday clubs across the county.

There are free places available on the HAF programme for children and young people aged four (reception class age) to 16, who are eligible for benefits-related free school meals.

There are also a limited number of free places available for children and young people on the HAF programme living in areas of high deprivation and/or from low-income households who are not in receipt of benefits related free school meals. These children and young people can be referred onto the programme by a professional.

Children who are eligible for Shropshire HAF should receive an email from their school in the next weeks, with a booking code and details of the club on offer. You can find out more about the Shropshire HAF programme on the HAF website.

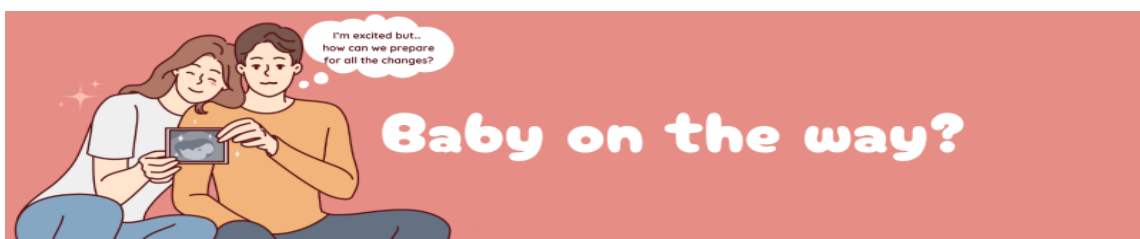

- Are you receiving everything you are entitled to? Turn2Us is a charity who believes everyone in the UK should have financial security so they can thrive. They offer a free benefits calculator and grants search on their website. - Credit unions are not-for-profit organisations that provide savings, loans and a range of services to their members. There are two Credit Unions in Shropshire, Fair Share Credit Union <https://www.fairshare.uk.com/fairshare-500-christmas-loan/> and Just Credit Union <https://justcreditunion.org/loans/saver-loans/> Both offer Christmas loans to help you pay for this year and save towards next Christmas.
- You can get support with housing, energy and food costs through [Shropshire Council's Cost of Living website](#). You can be referred to the foodbank by a professional who knows you, such as your housing association, GP, support worker or school. [They can also refer you for a Christmas Food and Gift Hamper](#) and schemes such as [Santa's Little Stars](#) who provide wrapped age-appropriate Christmas presents to children all over the county
