As part of their preparation for the mock trial competition, the mock trial team visited Worcester Magistrates' Court on Thursday 13th February to watch a court live in action. On this particular day, the courts were dealing with people who had been arrested and charged and were in court for the first time entering a 'guilty' or 'not guilty' plea. There were a range of allegations ranging from drink driving charges, possessing an offensive weapon in a public place, to sending private picture messages without consent. It was an eye-opening experience for the team; not only is the court a very formal and intimidating environment, but it is powerful to witness the repercussions of poor choices and alleged criminal behaviour and how the British justice system handles the fate of these people.
